1. Do I have to sign up for Family Friday?

There is no sign up. You are welcome to drop in anytime during the drop in block time for that Friday (not during lunch time and my prep times) and you get us “as is” during our learning time. I will try to give as much notice as possible for the drop in times. The schedule for Fridays may shift once we have another PD Day that changes our 5-day cycle.

2. Can I bring my child's siblings along?

We ask that siblings are not brought along. It's a regular school day and that means learning is still taking place. The more bodies we have in the class, the more disorganized our day can get and we want to keep our classroom as authentic as possible. In addition, students really enjoy having someone there for them and to play and learn alongside them. Family Fridays were chosen because it gives students something to anticipate and look forward to during the week.

3. How long will Family Fridays run?

Family Fridays will continue to run throughout the school year. The only days they will not run will be on holidays or if something else has come up and we can't have families in.

4. Do I need to sign in at the office or do I come to the side door at the kindergarten class?

Please come to the office when you arrive. We honour our safe schools policy which means all guests need to sign in and out through the office.

5. Do I need to come to every session?

Please feel free to drop in when YOU are available. We want this to be something families look forward to and not feel they have to commit a certain number of Fridays.

6. What if there are other families there when I come?

This is what makes the program so engaging. Families can spend time with their child as well as with other students and families in the room. This will only add to the purposeful play dialogue that takes place!
